

RESOLUTION # 18-1

WHEREAS, pursuant to 10 ILCS 5/24-B-3.1 and 10 ILCS 5/24C-3.1, when a precinct tabulation optical scan technology electronic voting system or a direct recording electronic voting system is used, the County Board may retain, consolidate, combine, alter, decrease or enlarge the boundaries of the precincts to change the number of registered voters of the precinct, establishing the number of registered voters within each precinct at a number not to exceed 800 as the appropriate county board determines will afford adequate voting facilities and efficient and economical elections.

WHEREAS, the County Board finds it necessary to adjust the precinct boundaries of a number of precincts to be described and listed with the advice of the County Clerk and Election Office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the members of the County Board, approve the realignments of the precincts to be detailed with an attachment by the County Clerk's Election Office.

Proposed Precinct Consolidations

Proposal 1 – Combine precincts Capital 24 & 25 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for 24 should be moved from Springfield So. Baptist Church, 225 N. Grand East to current polling place for Capital 25 which is Elliott Avenue Baptist Church, 501 W. Elliott. (CB 17) No splits will be created.

Proposal 2 – Combine precincts Capital 27 & 29 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for 29 should be moved from Heritage Manor, 900 Rutledge, to current polling place for Capital 27 which is Elliott Avenue Baptist Church, 501 W. Elliott. (? There are 79 voters who live at Heritage Manor who could do nursing home voting, parking is limited so that is why not proposing to keep polling place there.) (CB 28) No splits will be created.

Proposal 3 – Combine precincts Capital 37 & 38 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for both should be moved from Douglas Ave. United Methodist Church, 501 S. Douglas to the current polling place for Capital 43, which is the Westminster West Narthex, 533 S. Walnut. (CB25) No splits will be created.

Proposal 4 – Combine precincts Capital 98 & 129 to form 1 single precinct. Both precincts currently vote at the same location, Hope Presbyterian Church, 2211 Wabash Ave, and will remain at that same location. (CB29) No new splits will be created, however, 98 currently has Congressional split between the 17th, 18th & 19th (no voters) districts.

Proposal 5 – Combine precincts Capital 78 & 108 to form 1 single precinct. Both precincts currently vote at the same location, Iron Worker's Union Local #46, 2888 E. Cook, and will remain at that same location. (CB 9/19) *No new splits will be created, however, precinct 78 has split County Board districts 9 & 19, split School sub-districts 3/6 and split LLCC sub-districts 1/2, and precinct 108 has Congressional split between the 17th and 19th districts.*

Proposal 6 - Combine precincts Capital 33 & 91 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for precinct 91 should be moved from Capitol Care, 555 W. Jefferson, to the current polling place for Capital 33, which is Bonansinga Hi-Rise. *Note: there are 39 residents/registered voters at Capitol Care who would have the option of participating in Nursing Home voting.* (CB 28) No splits would be created.

Proposal 7 – Combine precincts Capital 26 & 53 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for precinct 26 should be moved from Bonansinga Hi-Rise, 825 W. Jefferson, to the current polling place for Capital 53, 1010 Bldg, 1010 North Park. *Note, residents of Bonansinga are in precinct 33 and will still vote there.* (CB28) No splits created.

Proposal 9 – Combine the West ½ of precinct Capital 111 with 101 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for precinct 101 should be moved from SPARC, 232 Bruns Lane, to the current polling place for Capital 111, Washington Plaza Apt., 2301 W. Washington. (CB25) No splits would be created.

Proposal 10 – Combine the East ½ of precinct Capital 111 with 113 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for east ½ of precinct 111 should be moved from Washington Plaza Apt., 2301 W. Washington to the current polling place for Capital 113, St. Agnes Hall, 245 N. Amos. (CB25) No splits would be created.

Proposal 11 – Take out east portion of precinct Gardner 5 and put in Gardner 3. The section being proposed is described as: Beginning at intersection of W. Washington and Meadowbrook, south along Meadowbrook to just north of Hazelbrook, west to just west of Willowbrook, south along this point to just south of Thornbrook (including houses on both sides of these streets), east to Meadowbrook, south to Old Jacksonville Rd, east to Gardner/Capital Township boundary (just west of Koke Mill), follow township boundary in northern and easterly direction along Koke Mill to W. Washington, west on W. Washington to Meadowbrook (excluding all areas in Capital township). Both precinct will continue to vote at same polling location.(Gardner 5 is CB27 and Gardner 3 is CB1) *The county board district will be the only split. There is no other Gardner Township precinct to combine with that would not cause a split.*

Proposal 12 – Take out the south portion (S. of Water Tower Rd.) of precinct Mechanicsburg 3 and put in Mechanicsburg 1. Polling place for voters in this portion of Mechanicsburg 3 should be moved from Dawson Firehouse, 109 Lewis to the current polling place for Mechanicsburg 1, which is Mechanicsburg Firehouse, 402 W. Main. This proposal along with #24 will eliminate Mechanicsburg 3 precinct. (CB 3) No splits will be created and it will reduce the number of Congressional districts in ME03 to 2 instead of 3.

Proposal 13 – Take out the north portion (N. of Water Tower Rd.) of precinct Mechanicsburg 3 and put in Mechanicsburg 2. Polling place for Mechanicsburg 2 should be moved from Buffalo Municipal Bldg, 600 S. Main, to the Dawson Firehouse, 109 Lewis to the current polling place for Mechanicsburg 3. This proposal along with #23 will eliminate Mechanicsburg 3 precinct. (CB 3) No splits will be created and it will reduce the number of Congressional districts in ME03 to 2 instead of 3.

Proposal 14 – Combine precincts Woodside 16 and Woodside 17 to form 1 single precinct. Both precincts currently vote at the same location, Jerome Civic Center, 2901 Leonard, and will remain at that location. (CB12) No splits would be created, however, there is a pre-existing split in Congressional District in Woodside 17.

Both precincts currently vote at the same location, The Warehouse, 2548 S. 1st Street, and will remain at that location. (Woodside 12 – CB21/Woodside 14 – CB23) *The county board district will be the only new split created. There is no other contiguous precinct for WD12 to combine with that is in the same CB District.*

Proposal 16 – Add 257 voters to Rochester 4 from Rochester 5 including Maplehurst (and small area directly north and west) and Wyndmoor (and small area directly south) and take out 269 voters from Rochester 4 and put in Rochester 6, including Camelot (and school/cemetery area directly southwest) and take out 17 voters from Rochester 5 and put in Rochester 6 including area directly south of Elementary School and east of Grove Park Subdivision. (CB9) No splits would be created.

Proposal 17 – Combine precinct Springfield 2 and Springfield 3 to form 1 single precinct. The polling place for Springfield 2 should be moved from Bergen Golf Course, 301 Eastdale, to the current poll for Springfield 3, Wesley Methodist Church, 2400 North Grand East. (Springfield 3 – CB19/Springfield 2 – CB9) *The county board district will be the only new split created. There is no other contiguous precinct for SP02 to combine with that is in the same CB District.*

Proposal 18 – Add the portion of Capital 142 that is east of Redland Drive to Capital 15. The polling place will be the same, K of C #364, 2200 S. Meadowbrook. (proposing to move poll for Capital 15 to K of C) (CB1) No new splits would be created.

Proposal 19 – Add the portion of Capital 15 that is in Lincoln Land sub-district 3 (south portion) to precinct Capital 145. The polling place for Capital 145 should be moved to the proposed poll for Capital 15, K of C #364, 2200 S. Meadowbrook. (Capital 15 – CB29/Capital 145 – CB24) *This will create a County Board split, but eliminate a LLCC sub-district split in Capital 15.*

Proposal 20 – Combine precincts Capital 73 & 117 to form 1 single precinct. Polling place for Capital 73 should be moved from Boys & Girls Club, 300 S. 15th to the current poll for Capital 117, Clear Lake Church of Christ, 2224 Clear Lake Avenue. (Pct 73 is CB20 and Pct 117 is CB19) *The county board district will be the only split. There is no other surrounding precinct to combine 73 with that would not cause splits in multiple districts and felt consolidation is necessary due to small number of voters in each precinct.*

The polling place for Capital 68 should be moved from Mine Rescue Station, 609 Princeton, to the current poll for Capital 69, The Warehouse, 2548 S. 1st Street. (Capital 68 – CB20/Capital 69 = CB23) *A county board split will be created, but only other alternative in same board district is CP80 and it would create splits in 5 different jurisdictions.*
