WHEREAS, the Sangamon County Department of Community Resources Committee of the Sangamon County Board has reviewed and approved the Subrecipient Agreement between the Sangamon County Department of Community Resources and the Office of Planning and Economic Development of the City of Springfield, Illinois.

WHEREAS the Department of Community Resources shall receive \$66,000 from the City of Springfield Office of Planning and Economic Development to mitigate lead in 10 units during the grant period beginning August 1, 2007 through the ending date of April 30, 2008 at about \$8,243 per unit utilizing the Do No Harm approach to lead hazard reduction in housing units with children present who are 6 years old or older.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Board of Sangamon County, Illinois in session this 14th day of August 2007 that the Subrecipient Agreement mentioned above is accepted.

Please accept this letter of support of the City of Springfield's application for a Housing and Urban Development "**Lead Based Paint Hazard Control Program**" grant.

The Sangamon County Department of Community Resources (SCCR) is the current provider of the Illinois Home Weatherization Program (IHWAP). The IHWAP program provides health and safety services as well as energy conservation services to over one hundred low-income households in Sangamon County at an average cost of \$5,000.00 per home. As a result, the amount of Sangamon County Weatherization (WX) funding leveraged for Springfield's lead control initiative would be approximately \$500,000.

Should the City of Springfield receive the opportunity to provide abatement services to its residents, the Department of Community Resources Weatherization Program pledges to conduct intakes and oversee the operations of services to successfully reach the goals outlined within the grant.

Sangamon County recognizes the need for the removal of lead-based paint to provide a safe home environment for its children. We feel our mission statement mirrors that of the grant for which the City is applying and offer our strong support and commitment to this project.

Dear Mayor Davlin:

Enclosed are three original copies of the *Get the Lead Out* – Phase 4 grant agreement 75381014 and the Basic Terms for the City of Springfield to conduct lead hazard work on an estimated 20 units. Please review the terms, and, if you agree, sign and return the three original copies back to the Department. The mailing address is:

The grant agreement will require the City of Springfield to conduct lead hazard work at a cost of \$160,000 (\$8,000/unit) for Materials and Labor, \$20,840 (\$1,042/unit) for administrative costs, and \$4,000 (\$200/unit) for relocation expenses which makes a gross cost of \$194,000. You are required to give a 10 percent local match. The local match commitment is calculated by taking 10 percent of the Total Gross Cost. The total match amount is \$19,984 and includes estimated owner match etc.
