WHEREAS, the Petitioner, Jesse Staab, has petitioned the Sangamon County Board requesting pursuant to Chapters 17.68 and 17.28, a rezoning from "A" Agricultural District to "I-1" Restricted Industrial District; and, pursuant to Chapter 17.66 a variance of Section 17.50.060(A) to allow the parking to remain unpaved (rock) instead of the required bituminous scal coat; and,

PLANNING COMMISSION STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Recommend denial of the requested I-1 zoning. The LESA score of 192 indicates the subject property is suitable for agricultural use only. In this case, the area has remained agricultural, so a spot of I-1 zoning is inappropriate. In the alternative, staff recommends approval of a Use Variance for a tree service business including outside storage of equipment provided the business is not open to the public. Granting a Use Variance for the tree service business will allow the petitioner to have the necessary outside storage for the business while keeping the parcel zoned Agricultural to be in harmony with the agricultural trend in the area. For the paving variance, the petition states the business will use heavy equipment which would cause continuous repairs to a paved surface. The Standards for Variation are met.

(i) Existing uses of property within the general area of the property in question.
 North, East, South. & West – Cropland.

- (ii) The zoning classification of property within the general area of the property in question.

  North, East, & South Agricultural. West Menard County Agricultural.
- (iii) The suitability of the property in question to the uses permitted under the existing zoning classification.
  - The LESA score of 192 indicates the subject property is suitable for agricultural use only. In this case, the area has remained agricultural, so a spot of I-1 zoning is inappropriate.
- (iv) The trend of development, within the vicinity since the property was originally classified.

The trend of development in the area is agricultural. In 2018, R-1 and a variance for a parcel less than 40 acres were granted for two parcels east of the subject property. In 2008, a CPU for scales for a grain elevator was granted for parcels northeast of the subject property.

### SANGAMON COUNTY RECOMMENDED STANDARDS FOR USE VARIATIONS

The Zoning Board of Appeals shall not recommend to the Sangamon County Board that the regulations of the zoning ordinance be varied as authorized in Section 17.66.010 thereof, unless it shall make findings of fact based upon the evidence presented to it in each specified case:

(i) that the variance is justified by a showing of special circumstances demonstrating practical difficulties or particular hardship in the way of carrying out the strict letter of the Zoning Regulations.

The recommended Use Variance will allow the tree service business to continue operating on the subject property while ensuring more intense industrial uses are not permitted should the tree service business close.

(ii) that the variance is compatible with the trend of development in the area.

The trend of development in the area is agricultural, so granting a Use Variance for the tree service business will ensure the parcel would not be able to develop with other industrial uses should the business ever close.

(iii) that the variance will benefit the community and be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Regulations.

Granting a Use Variance for the tree service business will allow the petitioner to have the necessary outside storage for the business while keeping the parcel zoned Agricultural to be in harmony with the agricultural trend in the area.

(iv) that the variance will not create a negative impact on the area, will not alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality.

Negative impacts are not anticipated.

## SANGAMON COUNTY RECOMMENDED - STANDARDS FOR VARIATIONS

The Zoning Board of Appeals shall not recommend to the Sangamon County Board that the regulations of this ordinance be varied as authorized in F. (1) hereof, unless it shall make findings of fact based upon the evidence presented to it in each specified case:

(i) that the property in question cannot be economically used or yield a reasonable return, if permitted to be used only for the conditions allowed by the regulations.

The tree service business will not be open to the public, and the rock parking lot is consistent with the trend toward non-pavement in the area. Additionally, the petition states the business will use heavy equipment which would cause continuous repairs to a paved surface.

(ii) that the plight of the owner is due to circumstances unique to the property and not generally applicable to other property in the area.

The tree service business will not be open to the public and will only have employees coming to the site which provides a unique circumstance to grant the requested paving variance.

(iii) that the variation, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality.

Negative impacts are not anticipated.
