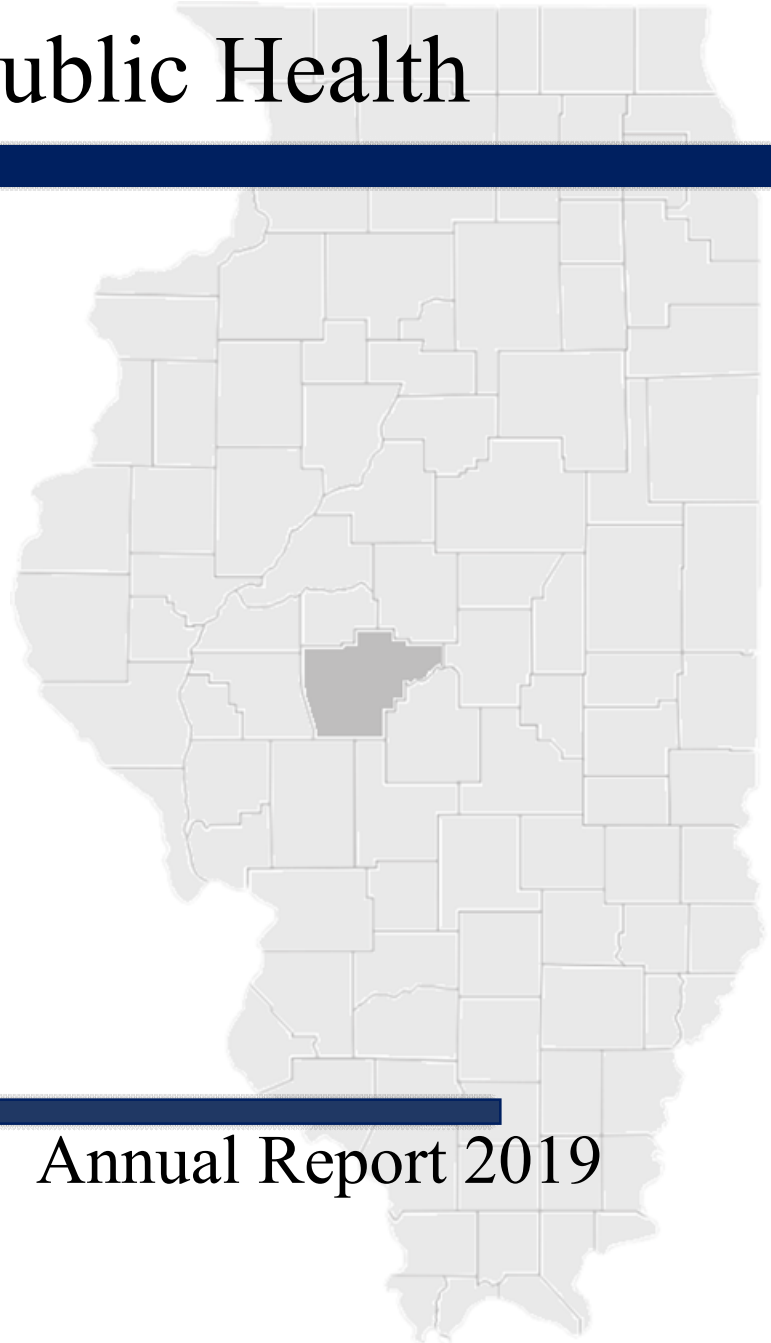

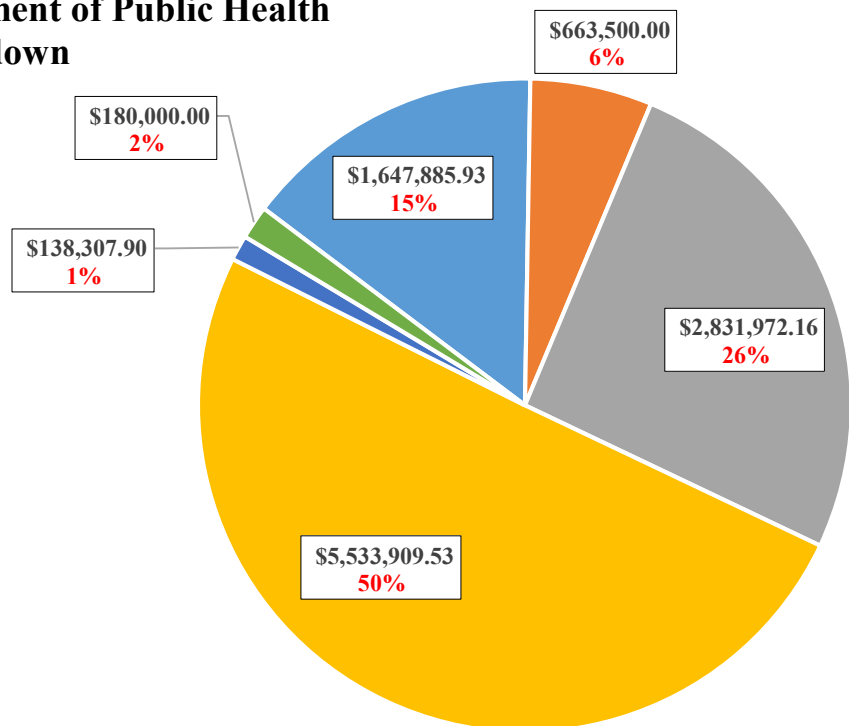

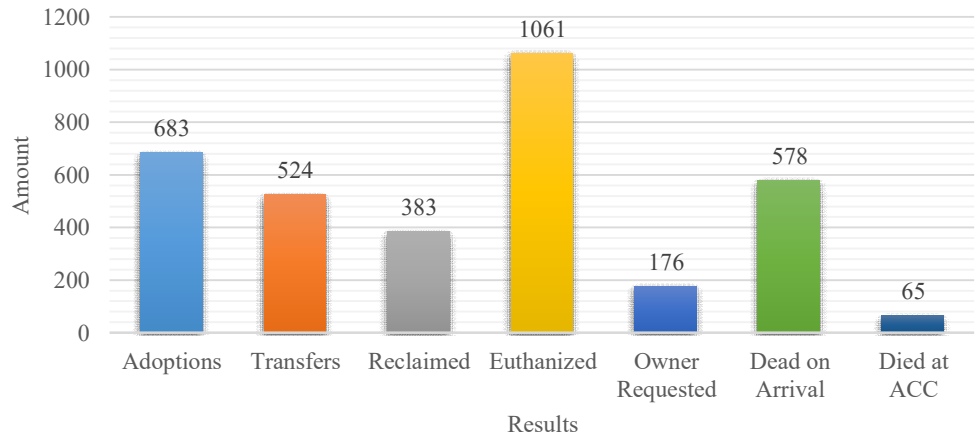


Sangamon County Animal Control & Adoption Center

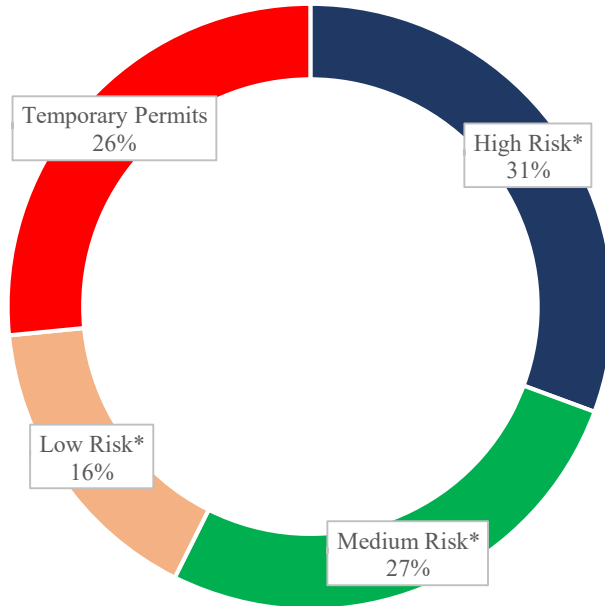
